Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Update

In June 2020, NGLA wrote an <u>open letter to the fraternal</u> <u>community</u>. We committed to:

- Collaborating with our partners to develop strategies to address racism against people of color within our organizations, campuses, and communities.
- Providing relevant educational programming tailored to the experiences of people of color in fraternal organizations.
- Offering education on anti-racism, allyship, and social justice to empower our community to lead more effectively.

In 2024, NGLA partnered with <u>The Harbor Institute</u> and other esteemed speakers to present Lectorials on R.A.C.E. at the NGLA Annual Conference. This initiative included nine programs focused on diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) topics. Additionally, NGLA collaborated with <u>One College Nation</u> to kick off the NGLA Annual Conference with dynamic and engaging programming aimed at fostering cultural awareness and building positive cross-cultural relationships.

In 2025, NGLA will continue its work in this area by hosting eight programs focused on DEIA topics during the NGLA Annual Conference. Additionally, NGLA has increased the number of scholarships available to support members of culturally-based fraternal organizations (CBFOs) attending the event.



Educational Programs

NGLA is committed to providing educational experiences and programming with the ultimate goal of helping the fraternal community align actions with values. These programs would not be possible without the support of our partners and sponsors.

NGLA Annual Conference Educational Programming

In 2024, NGLA offered an in-person annual conference experience. The in-person, weekend-long experience offered **60** undergraduate programs in **5** educational blocks plus **15** programs for professionals and **5** programs for graduate students throughout the conference. This is in addition to **3** keynotes, **8** programs as part of the Lectorials on C.H.A.N.G.E, **6** programs as part of the Lectorials on R.A.C.E., and **10** Experiential Programs.

This year was the first year of our experiential programs. This program emphasized hands-on, experiential learning for undergraduates. The sessions were 45 minutes. These activities engaged attendees in active learning, focusing on applying concepts in practical scenarios to foster a deeper understanding through experience. These large-scale educational programs emphasize active, student-centered learning, utilizing inquiry-based and adult learning methodologies. Collaborative and interactive activities replace traditional didactic lectures and tutorials, creating a dynamic and engaging learning environment.




Revenue
