In June 2020, NGLA wrote an [open letter to the fraternal community](#). We continue to be committed to:

- Collaborating with our partners to develop strategies to address racism against people of color within our organizations, campuses, and communities.
- Providing relevant educational programming tailored to the experiences of people of color in fraternal organizations.
- Offering education on anti-racism, allyship, and social justice to empower our community to lead more effectively.

In 2024, NGLA partnered with [The Harbor Institute](#) and other esteemed speakers to present Lectorials on R.A.C.E. at the NGLA Annual Conference. This initiative

included nine programs focused on diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) topics. Additionally, NGLA collaborated with [One College Nation](#) to kick off the NGLA Annual Conference with dynamic and engaging programming aimed at fostering cultural awareness and building positive cross-cultural relationships.

In 2025, NGLA continued its work in this area by hosting eight programs focused on Global Learning topics during the NGLA Annual Conference. Additionally, NGLA has increased the number of scholarships available to support members of culturally-based fraternal organizations (CBFOs) attending the event.

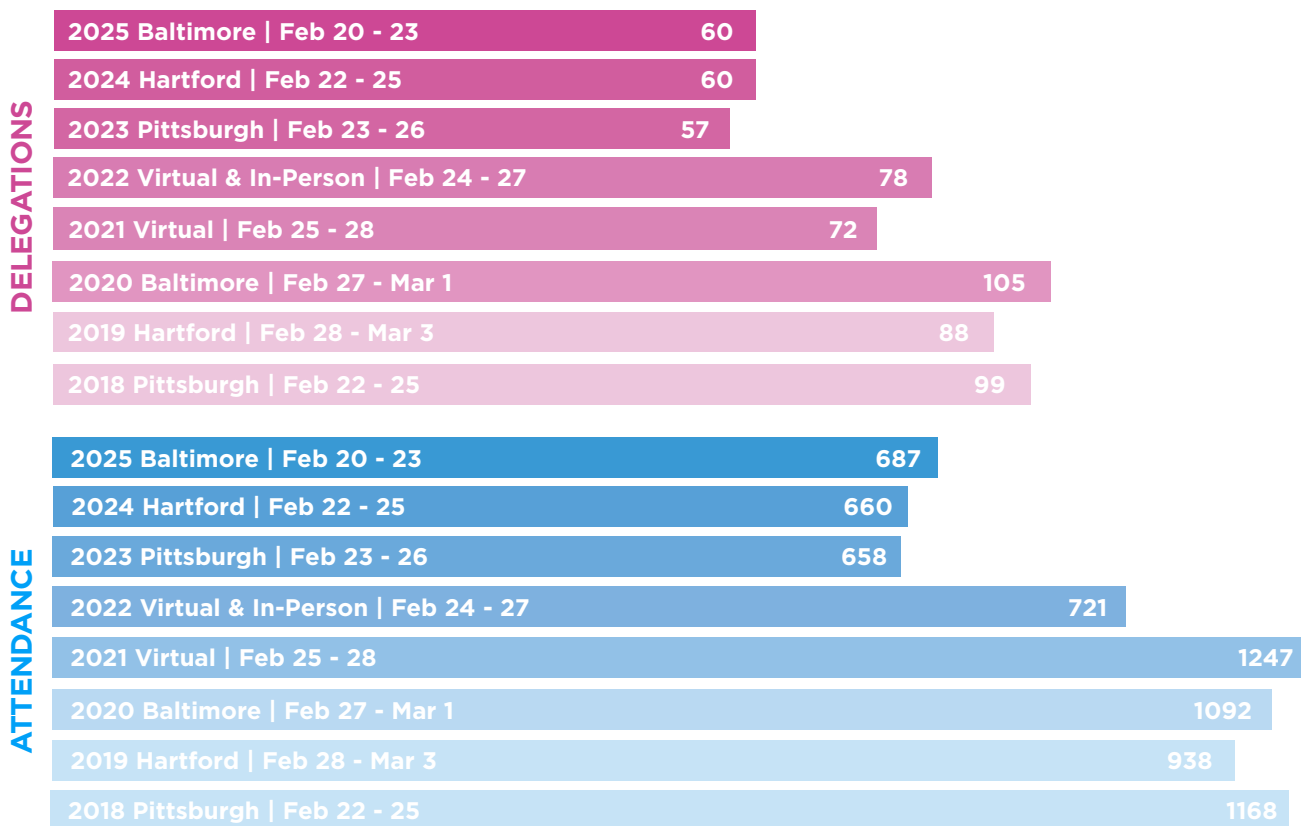

## Awards

Each year, the Northeast Greek Leadership Association (NGLA) recognizes fraternity and sorority chapters, councils, communities, and individuals for their outstanding accomplishments over the past year. Through innovative initiatives and commitment to the fraternal movement, everyone recognized has helped advance the mission of NGLA.

Submissions for the 2025 NGLA Awards were outstanding and plentiful. Applications showcased how both institutions and individuals prioritized academic achievement, civic engagement, leadership development, membership recruitment and intake, public relations, and risk reduction in creative and effective ways. This positive work continues to impact their organizations and campuses as a whole. Thank you to our community for submitting strong applications and demonstrating exceptional leadership!

In 2025, NGLA recognized 5 undergraduate student leaders, 1 graduate student, 3 professionals/volunteers, 7 chapters, 3 councils, and 4 campus communities. Congratulations to our [2025 NGLA Award Recipients!](#)

## Educational Programs

NGLA is committed to providing educational experiences and programming to help the fraternal community align actions with values. These programs would not be possible without the support of our partners and sponsors.

### NGLA Annual Conference Educational Programming

In 2025, NGLA received 194 program submissions through the Call for Programs process (excluding sponsored content), reflecting a notable increase from the previous year. These submissions came from 83 unique presenters and represented a broad range of topics and audiences. A key improvement this year was the expansion and restructuring of the Call for Programs to encompass all educational offerings supported by NGLA, including Keynotes, Educational Sessions, Virtual Programming, and Podcasts. All four Calls launched simultaneously with staggered closing dates, a strategy designed to increase clarity and engagement among potential presenters.

Of the total submissions, 171 were aimed at undergraduate audiences, and 23 were targeted at graduate and professional participants. Among the undergraduate-focused submissions, 141 were intended for general undergraduate attendees. At the same time, 30 were geared toward more specific communities—seven for culturally based fraternal organizations (CBFOs), one for NALFO members, two for NPHC members, fifteen for NPC communities, and five for NIC-affiliated organizations. Program topics spanned a diverse range of content areas, including Academic Success (3), Chapter and Council Management (37), Community Service and Philanthropy (6), Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Access (17), Fraternal Values (7), Health and Safety (25), Life After College (12), Personal Development and Wellness (46), and Public Relations and Recruitment (18).

Graduate and professional submissions commonly focused on themes such as workplace satisfaction—including financial stability, work/life balance, and adaptability—navigating student support with topics like hazing investigations and student motivation, and job preparedness, such as knowing when to leave a position, job hunting strategies, and skills not typically taught in graduate school. Of all submissions, 95 programs were chosen for presentation at the in-person conference, featuring 51 unique speakers. In addition, six virtual programs and four podcast episodes were selected through the same process.

In 2025, NGLA also continued partnering with national organizations to enhance the educational content offered at the conference. Council-based programming continued through contributions from NPC and NIC.

Additional sponsored programming was provided by Greek University, It's On Us, NALFO, the JED Foundation, and PurposelyPresent Speaking & Coaching. Notably, 48 of the total submissions came through the Keynote solicitation process. A separate form was used to track Educational Sponsored Programs, helping align them with educational outcomes.

Several significant structural changes were implemented in 2025. The Lectorials were phased out in favor of infusing DEI topics throughout the entire conference experience rather than isolating them within specific blocks. The Experiential and Extended Education blocks were used during the previously designated Lectorials programming times, ensuring that dynamic and engaging educational content remained available. Based on attendance and presenter feedback, NGLA recommends offering a combination of one 90-minute program and two 30-minute sessions during future conference blocks to improve engagement and accessibility. Presenter feedback was overwhelmingly positive, particularly regarding the presenter bags, which were well-received as a welcome addition to this year's experience.

Overall, the improvements to the Call for Programs process, the thoughtful integration of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) across the educational experience, and the introduction of presenter-focused enhancements contributed to a successful year for NGLA's educational programming efforts.

## NGLA Inaugural Event “The Conversation”

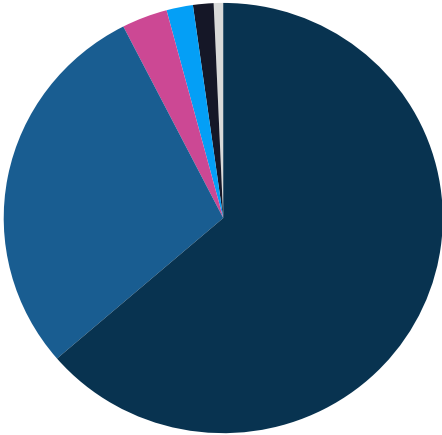
In 2025, the Northeast Greek Leadership Association (NGLA) launched its inaugural event, The Conversation, in partnership with The College of New Jersey and Plain. This two-day regional dialogue brought together 14 campus professionals, inter/national organization staff, and fraternal leaders for meaningful discussions on the future of fraternity and sorority life. Centered on hazing prevention and the implementation of the new Stop Campus Hazing Law enacted in December 2024, the program emphasized collaboration, education, and proactive solutions. Through interactive workshops and facilitated dialogue, participants developed strategies to strengthen partnerships, enhance community accountability, and cultivate safer, values-driven experiences across campuses and organizations.

## Revenue

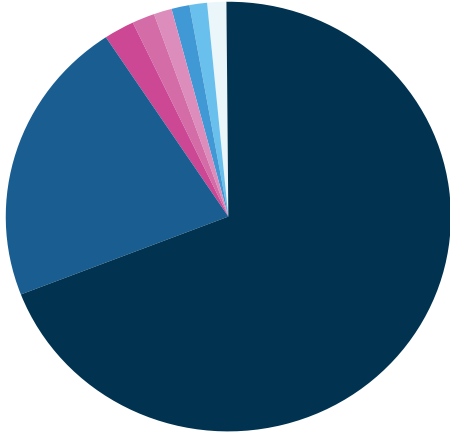
Our primary sources of revenue are the NGLA Annual Conference registration income, sponsorship revenue, and Silent Auction donations.
